The first 6 weeks (3 hrs per day, 5 days per week) is at the Ethiopian Community Association of Chicago facility at 4750 N. Sheridan Rd, Suite 249. The last four weeks (4 hrs a day) will be in the form of internship at the potential employer companies. The training prepares the participants for electrical, electronics, and/or mechanical assembler positions.

EMAT creates wide range of job opportunities, as it is of the first of its kind to integrate all the required skills to assemble electromechanical devices like transformers, switches, alternators, computers, motors and printed circuit boards. For detail course content please contact us.

What are the selection criteria?

Anyone who meets the following criteria:

- legally reside in the US and who meets the low income guideline,
- has level 3 English proficiency, has basic Math skills , and who has the desire and willingness to work as an assembler,
- pass the entrance exam and interview, and who has excellent dexterity.

Is there tuition fee?

No tuition fee. It is free for qualified participants.

Is there help on job search?

Our ultimate goal is to place job seekers in gainful employment with benefits. Ethiopian Community places the graduates in assembly jobs and continues supporting the graduates to retain their jobs. Most trainees are very likely to be hired by the company where they will have internship.

How is the training scheduled?

The training will be scheduled as much as possible to meet the needs of most participants.
