Number of Volunteers: 600 **Number of Pets Adopted:** 714 in 2008

Volunteer Opportunities

- Spay & Neuter Hotline:** Field phone requests and inquiries, and deliver discount certificates for veterinary services.
- Canister Management:** Pick-up and drop-off of Noah's Ark donation canisters at local businesses.
- Animal Care:** Provide exercise, grooming, bathing, and companionship to resident cats/kittens and dogs/puppies.
- Supply Drives:** Distribute wish lists to shoppers at local stores and collect contributions.
- Photography:** Take still photos and videos of our residents displayed on our web site.
- Spring and Fall Clean-up:** Ensure the shelter grounds remain clean and animal friendly.
- Fundraising Committees:** Help manage our fundraising events that occur throughout the year.
- Shelter Square Footage:** Approximately 5,000 square feet
- Facility Features:**
- Houses up to 35 - 45 cats and 25 - 30 dogs
 - 18 ft. X 7 ft. enclosed cat patio, 18 ft. X 12 ft. cat colony
 - 5 individual cages to house dogs and cats referred to as the 5-way
 - 3 puppy play yards
 - Holding area that houses 8 animals prior to vet checks
 - Isolation room which contains 12 cages for cats and 3 cages for dogs that are in need of medical attention

- A dedicated fund called the Cobi Fund assisted 35 animals with special medical needs in 2008
- All animals up for adoption are spayed/neutered and current on shots as their age permits.
- All animals are microchipped and receive a free 30-day trial of ShelterCare pet insurance.

Program Highlights

- Canister Program:** There are over 300 cans distributed throughout the area resulting in approximately \$5,100 collected in 2008.
- Spay/Neuter Hotline:** 973-347-5469 provides discounted spay/neuter rates through cooperating local veterinarians.
- Humane Education:** Volunteer, Peg Cannata & her partner Charlie visited over 15 local school and community groups in 2008. Program attendees ranged in age from 3 to 18 years.
- Shelter Tours:** The staff hosts a 30-minute workshop and tour for community groups and scout troops. Girl Scouts earn the bronze award for their participation. Over 20 shelter tours were given to girl and boy scout troops and community organizations in 2008. Visitors are encouraged to donate in-kind items from the shelter's wish list during their visit.
